What You Can Do:

#1 - Follow up-to-date info: www.shaleshock.org, catskillmountainkeeper.org, fmce.org

#2 - **Pass Federal regulation**: **H.R. 2766 (FRAC Act)** will repeal the exemption for hydraulic fracturing from the Safe Drinking Water Act. Call your representative to encourage them to support this bill. A companion bill, **S.1215**, has the same purpose. Call Senator Schumer 202-224-6542 and Senator Gillibrand at 202-224-4451 to thank them for co-sponsoring the bill.

#3 - **Strengthen federal regulation**: Fax Lisa Jackson, Administrator at the US EPA at 202-501-1450 and encourage her to enforce existing federal laws regulating hydrofracturing.

#4 - **Support NY State legislation**: Ask your NYS assemblyperson to support **A.8784** which requires disclosure of chemicals in "fracking" fluid and permits for withdrawal of more than 5,000 gallons of water per day. Ask your NYS Senator to introduce companion legislation to A.8784. Thank Sen. Gillibrand for calling for an extension to the public comment period.
